at Braelea Park Stud (“the stud”), 615 Broadgully Road, Diamond
Creek, Victoria and enclose \$350 payment of a non-refundable
booking fee. I acknowledge I have read, understood, and agree to be
bound by the conditions, regulations and charges set out hereunder.

Conditions and Regulations of Service:

1. The stallion will serve the mare during the aforesaid season and the owner shall pay to the stud the following charges:

(a) Groom’s Fee	\$400 on delivery of mare to stud
(b) Service Fee	\$600 prior to removal from stud
2. If the mare is required to be kept at the stud for service and/or foaling or until otherwise removed by the owner, the owner shall pay the following additional charges:

(a) Agistment	\$12 per day or part thereof
(b) Agistment with Foal	\$15 “ “ “ “
(c) Swab at Stud	\$30
(d) Drench	\$25
(e) Foaling at Stud	\$250
(f) Farrier	At farrier’s charges
(g) Veterinary Surgeon	To owner’s account
3. The owner is responsible for all transport arrangements to and from the stud and agrees to provide forty-eight hours notice of delivery and removal of the mare.
4. The mare shall continue during the service and agistment at the risk of the owner from any accident, illness, or misadventure. Every reasonable precaution for the care and protection of the mare will be taken by the stud. If at any time the stud has suspicion

of, knowledge of, or notice that the mare is apparently suffering from illness or accident, it shall, as soon as is reasonably practical give notice thereof to the owner, or in the case of urgency call in a veterinary surgeon without prior notice and the owner shall be responsible for any charges thereby incurred.

5. The stud warrants that all fences, gates and enclosures in which the mare is to be served and agisted are in a reasonable state of repair but is not responsible to the owner for loss or injury which may occur to the mare through escape or attempted escape of the mare from a paddock or stable in which it may be enclosed. The owner shall indemnify the stud against any claim made against it in consequence of any trespass of the mare.
6. The mare is to be presented by the owner with registration papers or copies thereof and a veterinary certificate of clean swab taken during the cycle prior to delivery to the stud. The mare is to have been drenched, had inoculations for tetanus and strangles shortly before delivery and shall be delivered with shoes removed.
7. The stud shall be entitled to refuse service to any mare deemed in its judgement to be ill tempered, poorly trained or otherwise unsuitable for breeding.
8. The stud shall be entitled to call in a farrier to attend to the mare if required in its judgement and the owner shall be responsible for the farrier's charges.
9. The stud shall be entitled to call in a veterinary surgeon to attend to the mare for routine attention associated with the service without notice and the owner shall be responsible for the charges of the veterinary surgeon.
10. The stud will at all times during the agistment of the mare provide proper paddock accomodation and such food as is ordinarily given and will take all reasonable steps to keep the mare in good and proper condition.
11. In the event the mare is left longer than fourteen days after notification to the owner of a positive test in foal or notification to the owner that in the judgement of the stud the mare is an unlikely

breeder, of ill temper or otherwise deemed unsuitable for breeding, an additional daily agistment charge will be made of \$12 per day.

12. All fees, costs and charges shall be paid by the owner to the stud prior to the removal of the mare from the stud.

13. In the event of the mare served being certified not in foal by a veterinary surgeon within fifty days of the date of last service, and provided that such certification is provided to the stud within fourteen days of the date whereof and in no other case, the mare will be served next season without deposit and stud fee, save and except any groom's fee. In the event service is unsuccessful in such successive year then the owner will be entitled to substitute an alternative suitable mare on the same terms and conditions contained herein.

14. This agreement shall not be deemed binding on the stud until acceptance has been acknowledged by signature of its duly authorised officer hereto.
